Akamashuku Historical Parade

Akama-shuku, located on the Karatsu Kaido, is one of the 21 post towns in Chikuzen. It flourished as a post town from the Edo period until the arrival of the railway in the Meiji period and served as a hub for goods from the Munakata region. Today, you can still find rows of traditional houses featuring white walls and lattice windows. Enjoy a leisurely walk through this historic townscape while dressed in period attire.
