It is a premium seaweed, prized for its rich aroma and umami flavor that fills the mouth.




Karashi Mentaiko

Fukuoka is one of Japan's leading sake-producing regions, home to many breweries.




Yakitori

Fukuoka's Renowned Chef & Editor Reveal

Hidden Power Behind

Fukuoka Cuisine

Fukuoka is attracting attention as a "Kingdom of Food." To uncover where its true appeal lies, we spoke with a Michelin one-star chef and local experts who share the latest news and topics about Fukuoka with the world. Let their insights inspire your next journey to Fukuoka.

Fukuoka — a place offering diverse food, sake, and unique experiences.

— What aspects of Fukuoka's food are you most proud to share with visitors?

People often say, "Everything tastes delicious in Fukuoka." It makes me happy to know that, both in Japan and abroad, Fukuoka is seen as a place where visitors can always enjoy truly great food.

— What is the signature food of Fukuoka?

First and foremost, it's fish. A wide variety of seafood is available, and because it is so fresh, even oily fish like saba (mackerel) can be enjoyed raw—as in goma saba, mackerel sashimi dressed with sesame.

— How about other foods?

Definitely fruits and vegetables. They are known for their fragrance and sweetness, with varieties that differ by region. For example, Kitakyushu produces brands such as Ōba shungiku and Wakamatsu Shiokaze® cabbage. Visitors may also be surprised by the wide range of seasonal fruits.

— Mr. Fukuyama, what do you consider to be Fukuoka's soul food?

Of course, there are countless dishes such as tonkotsu ramen, mizutaki, motsunabe, and mentaiko. But personally, I would say it's udon. Some noodles are soft, others have a bit of firmness, and the broths and tempura toppings come in endless variety. With so many famous udon chains originating in Fukuoka, it truly the city's soul food.

— Fukuoka has a lot of yakitori (grilled chicken skewer) restaurants, doesn't it?

In fact, Fukuoka ranks first among 21 major cities in the number of yakitori shops per 100,000 people. (※1) From casual spots to upscale restaurants offering full-course menus, each has its own unique

character. Chicken is also a favorite at home, with household spending on it ranking highest among the 21 cities. (※2)

— Since you opened your restaurant in 2002, have visitors' ways of enjoying Fukuoka's food changed?

I think they've changed a lot. The classic dishes featured in guidebooks are still popular, but more visitors now explore Fukuoka's wider culinary scene—Italian, French, sushi, and izakaya. Many begin with a quick drink at a standing bar, continue to another restaurant for dinner, and end the evening at a bar.

— What makes Fukuoka's sake and spirits distinctive?

Fukuoka is home to many breweries and distilleries, producing a wide variety of sake, shochu, whisky, and wine. Many of these locally made drinks have unique flavors that pair beautifully with Fukuoka's cuisine. Since Fukuoka is especially renowned for its seafood, sake is highly recommended.

— Mr. Fukuyama, at your restaurant you not only serve Fukuoka's local sake but also use regional pottery, don't you?

Yes, I use pieces such as Agano-yaki, Koishiwarayaki, and Takatori-yaki. Experiencing the beauty of local craftsmanship through these traditional wares is truly one of the joys of enjoying Fukuoka's food culture as a traveler.

— What makes Fukuoka's restaurants different from those in other areas?

A defining feature is their warm hospitality. People in Fukuoka have a strong desire to make guests happy, which is why many customers return to the same places—sometimes simply to see the owners. And of course, Fukuoka is famous for its yatai (food stall). These days, their menus are more diverse than ever, and the close interaction among customers adds to the charm. Dining at a yatai is truly an experience worth trying.

— What message do you have for people visiting Fukuoka?

Fukuoka offers a rich variety of food, local sake, and unique experiences. Even with just an hour's journey by car or train from the city center, you can discover delicious specialties in many different towns. The region also boasts hot springs and sightseeing spots, so take your time and fully enjoy all that Fukuoka has to offer.



Owner Chef of "Goh" and "GohGan" Goh Fukuyama

Born in Fukuoka in 1971, French Chef Takeshi "Goh" Fukuyama opened his restaurant "La Maison de la Nature Goh" in 2002. Since 2016, it has been selected eight times for the prestigious "Asia's 50 Best Restaurants," a remarkable achievement as the only restaurant from Kyushu to earn this honor. In 2019, it was awarded one Michelin star. In December 2022, he launched two new restaurants—Goh and GohGan—in the "010 Building" near Canal City Hakata.

Founded in 1998, "Fukuoka Now" is a multilingual media platform that captures Fukuoka's present and the allure of Kyushu. Their mission is to inspire more people to love and cherish Fukuoka. When introducing Fukuoka's cuisine to international visitors, they go beyond taste—sharing the narrative behind them.

— Since you both often guide international visitors, what culinary charms of Fukuoka would you proudly share with them?

Nick (N): Saba, or mackerel. It can be enjoyed raw, and we're proud of our set meal featuring mirin-flavored grilled mackerel. I'm also a big fan of oysters! What I'd really like to showcase are the everyday dishes we enjoy here.

Emiko (E): Seasonal flavors are a must-try. Fruits in particular are abundant and delicious. Of course, you can enjoy them at restaurants, but there are also unique local experiences — like strawberry picking, something you can only do here in the production areas."



— What is unique about Fukuoka's restaurants?

N: Many of Fukuoka's eateries are small, owner-run establishments. One of their charms is the close connection between chefs and customers: owners often take time to explain the ingredients and drinks in detail. The friendly atmosphere makes it easy for visitors to enjoy casual conversation.

E: Chefs and producers work closely together. It is this closeness that makes it possible for Fukuoka to offer truly exceptional culinary experiences.

— What souvenirs would you recommend?

E: My top recommendation is Yame green tea. Matcha is wonderful, of course, but Gyokuro and Sencha also have distinctive flavors worth savoring. They make excellent gifts, and I especially hope visitors will enjoy them at home as an everyday luxury.

— How can visitors from abroad find places where they don't feel a language barrier and can enjoy communication?

N: There are plenty of cozy places where you can feel comfortable even without speaking a foreign language. Popular spots where locals gather also tend to have a warm and welcoming atmosphere.

— Are there any customs or etiquette that visitors from abroad should know?

N: You may be surprised that quite a few restaurants only take cash, and many have you pay at the cashier instead of at your table.

E: And not just for overseas visitors—when taking photos in a restaurant, it makes a good impression if you ask first.

— What message do you have for people visiting Fukuoka?

N: Step into a side street, check out restaurants from outside, and then give it a try. Fukuoka is full of great places to eat, so go explore and discover your own favorite spot.

Local sake and food are a perfect match. I also want to share the charms of tableware.

— What in Fukuoka's cuisine are you proud to share with visitors?

The Asakura area where I live has a climate with big temperature differences, which makes the vegetables, fruits, and rice especially delicious. We also use local mountain vegetables and try to incorporate natural ingredients as much as possible. I hope visitors will enjoy the authentic flavors, including the natural bitterness and astringency.

— What are the charm of Fukuoka's sake and local drinks?

Food and drink produced from the same soil naturally go well together. In my restaurant, I serve four to five kinds of sake, all from Fukuoka Prefecture. Sake from places like Kurume, Kaho, and Yame—areas known for clean water and excellent rice—is truly delicious.

— Are there any unique ways of cooking?

In Fukuoka, Hakata Zōni is traditionally prepared with yellowtail (buri) and a specific type of turnip called Katsuona. In the Asakura area, we have a unique tradition of eating mochi (rice cake) inside Chawanmushi (Japanese steamed egg custard). On New Year's Day, we serve regular zōni, and on the second and third days, when we tend to get tired of the same dish, we switch to serving Chawanmushi with mochi. These special New Year dishes are also featured at my restaurant.

— Are there any special local ingredients?

Akizuki's Kudzu (arrowroot) is so popular that people come from distant places just to buy it. Its smooth and thick texture is truly exceptional. At my restaurant, we make sure to feature kudzu in dishes such as edamame (soybeans) tofu and renkon (lotus root) tofu, even though our menu changes monthly. Customers can also enjoy Kawatake (Suizenji-nori), a rare freshwater laver that is harvested exclusively in the Kogane River in Asakura City.

— I noticed your beautiful plating—the tableware is very distinctive.

I redesign the interior layout and update the menu seven times a year. I conceive each dish together with the tableware, as the two are inseparable in my approach. I experience profound joy at the moment when my ideas take shape and the dish achieves perfect harmony. The tableware, created by contemporary artists, is distinctive yet versatile enough to embrace almost any type of cuisine.

— What message do you have for people visiting Fukuoka?

When customers from overseas visited my restaurant, they were delighted and said, "It's like an art museum!" I sincerely hope that they will visit various shops and immerse themselves in the hospitality each place offers.






Hodoai no Yado Roppokan
